Surfactant and cosolvent free diclofenac injection (generic Dyloject)



Marketed diclofenac-Na injections

Problems of approved diclofenac-Na injections (containing at least 25 mg/ml active)

Akis[®]: use of sensitizing polysorbate 20

(TWEEN®)

Dynapar® AQ: use of cosolvent (tetrahydrofurfuryl

propyleneglycol)

Voltarol®: use of cosolvent (benzyl alcohol)

Dyloject®: withdrawn due to stability problems




Cyclolab's proprietary diclofenac-Na composition

- Novel (no prior art), inventive → patentable
 - Aqueous
 - Syringeable (suitable viscosity)
 - Acceptable osmolality
 - Well tolerable components (no cosolvent or surfactant!)
- Preliminary data suggests appropriate stability
 - -Low production cost
 - High concentration (>37.5 mg/ml)
